Heamoor Draft Vision Statement...

(Definition of a Vision Statement: 'An image of the future we seek to create')

We are an aspirational school actively engaged in a continuous process of whole-school improvement on our journey towards becoming an outstanding school. Empowering our pupils to be confident, resilient, independent learners is the corner stone of the education we offer. In a rapidly changing world, our pupils will have success for today and be prepared for tomorrow.



Guidance on School Vision Statements

Concentrate on **where you believe the School will be in five years' time**. School mission statements focus on today whereas school vision statements contain details of the future of the school - its vision (the future plans with aims and objectives). **These types of statements focus on tomorrow**. We write vision statements to clarify and emphasise future goals and direction their establishment is taking.

Definition of a Vision Statement: 'An image of the future we seek to create'

School Vision Statements - How long should it be?

A good example is one sentence or a short paragraph consisting of between two and four sentences. The importance of this type of description should not be underestimated. A good vision statement **focuses the minds** of the teachers, children and parents on the aims and goals of the school. One small sentence can convey confidence in the future direction and inspiration for our school.

Definition of a Mission Statement: 'Purpose, reason for being'... defined simply "Who we are and what we do".

Aspirations: We actively engage in a challenging process of continuous whole-school improvement which impacts directly on securing and sustaining strong outcomes for all our stakeholders on our journey towards becoming an outstanding school.

Access: We ensure equal access for all our pupils to the full range of educational opportunities provided by the school enabling them to become resilient and independent learners who experience success today and are prepared for tomorrow.

Achievement: We aim for excellence in all that we do enabling our pupils to make better-than-expected rates of progress and progressively close the attainment gap as well as secure important wider outcomes including positive behaviour and high attendance

Summer Clubs

Cluttered Cloakrooms!

This year we have become increasingly aware of how cluttered the children's cloakrooms have become. One of the factors contributing to the lack of space is the **size of some of the rucksacks** that the children are bringing into school. Although we know that occasionally children need to bring rucksacks/bags to school with clothing or kit for clubs, in general bags of this size are not necessary. We are also concerned that items in these rucksacks e.g. reading books and diaries are frequently damaged by leaking drinks bottles etc.

The only things that our children need to bring to and from school are their **reading book, reading/homework diary** and any **homework** all of which can be *easily* carried within our school book bags. There is **no need** for them to bring any of the following to school: *pencil cases, phones, folders, notebooks or toys*.



Therefore, we have made the decision that from after Easter—**ALL year groups, with the exception of year 6, will be expected to use a book bag**. As one of the privileges of being our eldest pupils as well as a way of assisting with their transition to secondary school, our Y6 children will be allowed to bring rucksacks to school and to bring a pencil case of their own. **For this summer term, we will also allow our Year 5 pupils to continue using their rucksacks** rather than expect them to buy a book bag for just one term before they move up to y6.

Book bags are available from the school office at the cost of £4.00. Please note that the school does not make any profit from the sale of these bags this is to ensure that they are offered to parents at the cheapest price possible.
