
# Year 5 Porthpean

# Here comes the summer sun...

Now that it looks like Summer has finally arrived, from next week we will allow the children to eat their **packed lunches outside at lunchtime** and to **play up on the school field**. In order to ensure that the children can make

the most of these new lunchtime arrangements, we would like

to remind you of some important **welfare & safety**

**arrangements: We expect every child to have sun cream**

**applied every day** before they come to school. Between lunchtime play and PE lessons on the field, it could be possible for them to be exposed to the sun for up to 2 hours on certain days, so they will need plenty of sun protection.

There are several once daily products available at similar cost to the top up brands and this may be an option for those who are forgetful or reluctant to protect

themselves. Please note, that it is not the school's policy to provide sun cream and

we can not insist it is applied. If pupils appear not to be suitably protected from the sun, teachers or support staff may make the decision that they remain indoors if there is a high

risk. Sporting events are notoriously deceiving as cooling breezes can hide the intensity of the heat and the children's skin can easily burn. We are appealing to parents to support us

with these arrangements. Staff will remind pupils regularly but we cannot do much more than this. For the few who are allergic to sun cream please encourage them to cover up and

wear a hat.



**We strongly recommend that all children come to school every day with a **named sunhat and a full & labelled water bottle**.** School coats, jumpers and water bottles all

need to be clearly named so that they can be easily identified and returned if misplaced. Parents & children are asked to continue to send in

coats (can be lighter weight) for the foreseeable future as weather can be very variable during the day.

If any parent *does not* want their child to sit outside for packed lunches at the present time, then please let our school office know.
