As their end of term project finale the Children from Indigo Class will be hosting a Viking event at Penlee house from 10am - 12noon on Tuesday 5th December.


They will be sharing stories of Norse mythology, selling their Viking jewellery and sharing Viking stew, all in traditional Viking costume!
