These sessions were fully interactive and involved both mental and physical participation including role-play, fun activities and challenges. became apparent during the sessions that there are many children in our school who potentially putting themselves at risk with many children having open Tiki Tok and Snapchat accounts to name just a couple. Red Class have been learning about the Victorians. We have spent some time comparing how school is today compared to the past. We have also looked at the type of clothes Victorians wore, creating our own Victorian people and comparing their life today,

to the life of a Victorian child. Making links and comparisons between what they do at home to help and the work life of a Victorian child.





Out topic, "Toys Through Time' has allowed us to look at toys that Victorian children may have played with and how these changed depending on their wealth. Some of the children chose to make spinning tops during their own learning whilst some played a game of hopscotch outside.



In Maths, we have been learning to represent the numeral 5 and we have been learning to show one-more and one-less than a number. We have enjoyed using our number lines and number tracks to help jump forward and backwards to find our answer.




Our story voting station














# Beautiful Balancing!

## Yellow Class



## Indigo Class










### Crossfit Training






Thank you for all the support with the Maths homework-the messages back from the children are along the lines of 'mum loves the homework, she wants to do it more than me'.
