# European Day of Languages



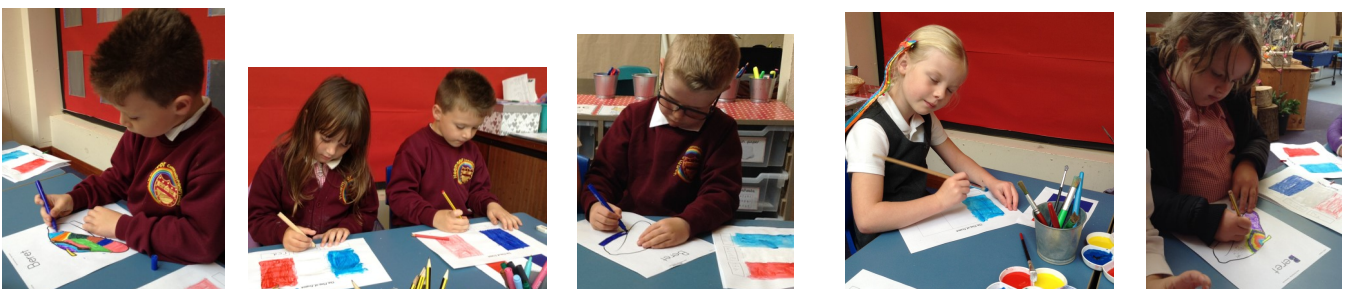
This week we celebrated European Day of Languages across the school.

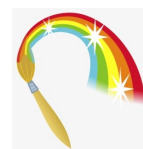




# Red Class

# Yellow Class

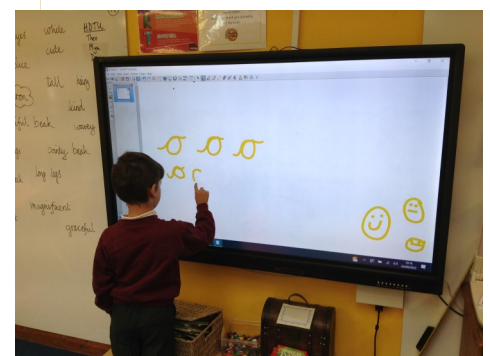


We have had a great couple of weeks in Yellow class. Take a look at what we've been up to.

# Indigo Class



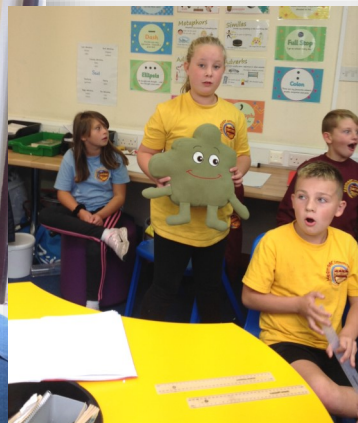
## Active Maths

# Mabel Update



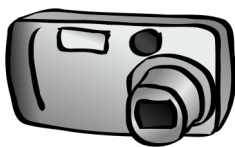
