Choose two words to describe how the Lighthouse Keeper might be feeling when he is sat on the floor after dropping the light. (You could explain why you have chosen these words.)





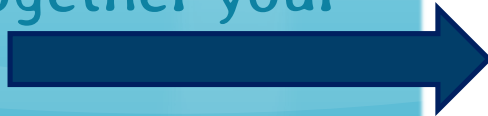
Predict

When we're predicting what might happen, we can use adverbs and modal verbs to show how likely something is to happen. There might be several possibilities but, by using these words, you can show which option you think is the most likely.

Adverbs	Modal verbs
undoubtedly	will
definitely	must
certainly	shall
clearly	ought to
obviously	should
surely	can
quite likely	would
probably	may
possibly	might
maybe	could
hardly
