


In Literacy, we have been busy making wanted posters, and describing characters from the story! We even had to think of a reward if someone found the Gingerbread Man.



The Yellow Class team have been absolutely blown away by the amazing work you have been completing at home, and in school. It makes us all so proud. Here are just a few examples:













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























