Read Write Inc. Phonics

We are very excited to announce that from September we will be moving to the Read Write Inc programme for phonics. This has been supported by the Reading Hub and we are lucky enough to have been chosen to be a partner school. This system will allow us to develop our already robust system in school and ensure that children are reading books which carefully match the sounds they are learning. All staff in school will be trained in this so that there is the opportunity for phonics interventions throughout the school where needed. We are very excited to get started! During the first week of term all children in EYFS and KS1 will be assessed so that we have a clear indication of the progress they have made during the period of home learning. There will be more information for parents in September.
