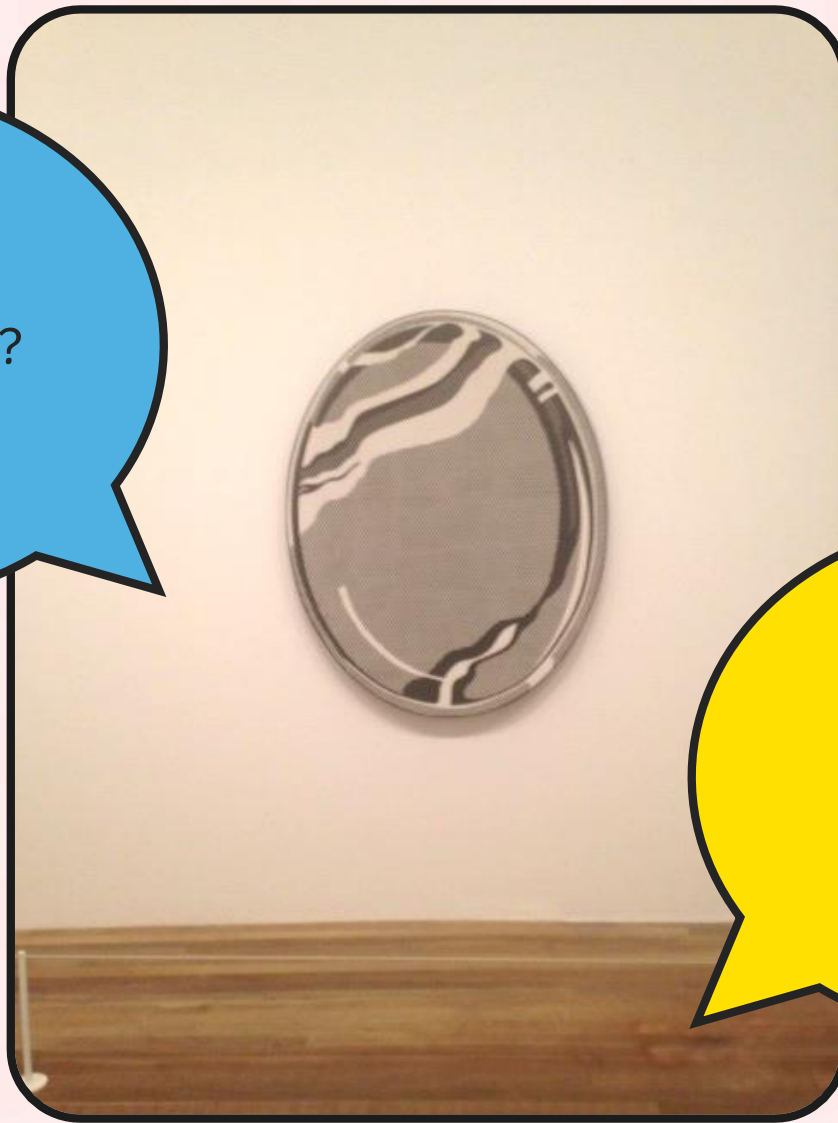

Comic Strip Art



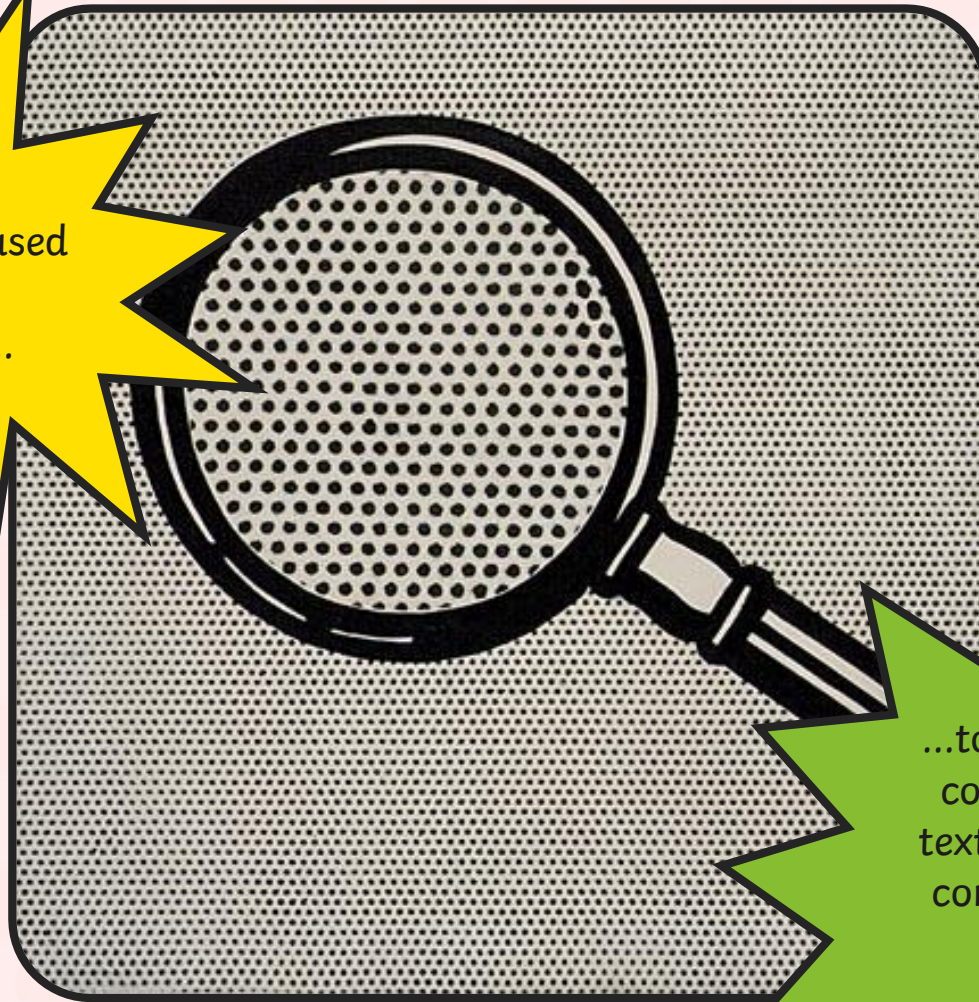
Lichtenstein

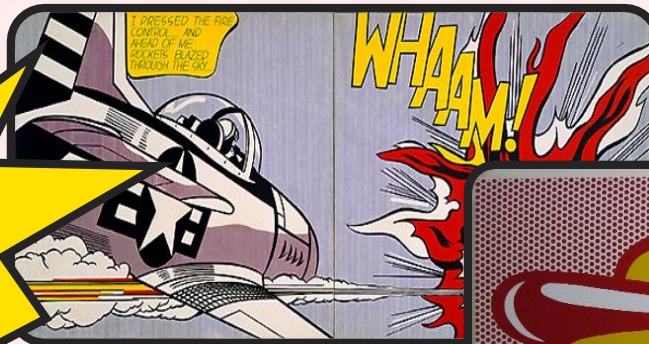
