- Children need a named water bottle each day, long hair also needs to be tied back.

Please be kind and patient to school staff, if you are unsure of something they are more than happy to help!








Although we have had to introduce a slightly different menu than normal; our school kitchen, or Rainbow Café as its known in school is producing some very tasty food for our school packed lunches.
