Read t number sentence, build it using two dinner plates or your part whole machine placing different items onto it. Once you have each number sentence say the number sentence you have buil loud and then have a go at writing it on your whiteboard at he Try and write your numerals for your number sentence fro memory, but use your numeral formation sheet if you find a nu tricky. Practice writing the tricky words that we have been practicing in school. Extra challenge—Can you use these words and write them in a sentence. *Worksheet on the phonics page*		Using construction toys at home, choose your favourite two te and create a journey for them. This might include a bridge m from an old tube, a river made from a tea towel, a forest of that you have drawn. Think about the journey they will go on, as many prepositions as possible.
