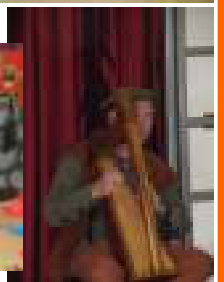
THANKYOU for supporting our recent book fair. We sold £537 worth of books which means that we had **£300+** to spend on books for our library.

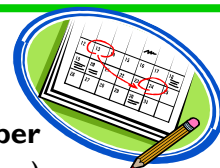

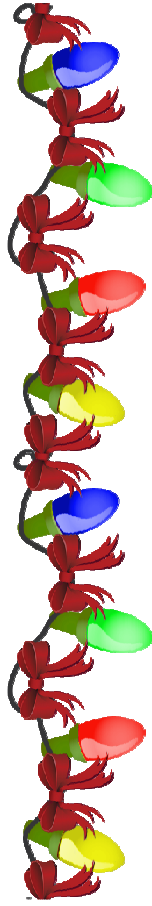
