

Red Class





This week Red Class have enjoyed using the outside play equipment before our morning phonics lessons.

This has given the children the opportunity to develop their fine and gross motor skills. Both fine and gross motor skills play an important part in developing a child's ability to mark-make, as well as their engagement in emergent writing.

By developing the muscles in the whole arm to the finger tips, children begin building the strength needed to manipulate mark-making tools including pens, pencils and paint brushes.







Any gross motor activities will support your child with their emergent writing especially when encouraging: climbing, pulling and balancing.
