Changes to reading in the Red Class

Following my first week in the class I have re-evaluated the way that reading is done both in class and at home. The amount of reading that is being done at home is **fantastic** and I hope this continues.

At school the children now have a change of book every week where they can take home <u>two</u> books. These will be their books for that week in addition to a book they have chosen from the school library.

The focus for the week in terms of home reading will be the quality of the reading rather than the quantity of books being read. This will allow the children to really explore the books they choose, talking about the story and the characters.

In addition to this, you will find a sheet in your child's book-bag that lists the most common 'tricky words'. These are words that we cannot use our phonics rules to decode e.g. the, said, my. In order to write independently write sentences please could you practise looking and writing these words at home to support them with their school writing.
