"Challenge Partner", Mr Mark Lees. Mark is a registered Ofsted inspector and therefore his scrutiny of the work of the school is always invaluable.

After receiving his report, we would like to take this opportunity to celebrate just a couple of the comments he made about our lovely school;



After undertaking a learning walk of the school he said, "The school was calm, focused and hardworking during this learning walk. Leaders and staff have created an immaculate learning environment that provides places for academic study and rooms to support social and emotional behaviours as and when required."

He added, "This caring and nurturing environment was again observed during this learning walk and the many pupils with EHC plans were well supported."

He feels that, "There are a large number of pupils with complex and at times challenging needs, during this visit, these pupils were extremely well managed and supported."

"All pupils are making secure progress from their starting points and pupils are beginning to recover the lost learning from the national school closures. Books are marked and feedback is consistent. There is a notable improvement in presentation, handwriting"

He added that, "Leaders are certainly not resting on their laurels at Heamoor school and following the successful OFSTED inspection are now ready to review, evaluate and further strengthen the school's curriculum."

"The care and guidance of staff is apparent, staff know that they can approach leaders with concerns and that they work hard to reduce burdens and workload where they can. The recently introduced supervision scheme will further strengthen this support. "

We looked carefully at their shapes and features in order to paint them. Look at the detail!








We spent time making a version of the Rive Nile outside. We had to use our gross motor skills and strength to dig out the tunnels and then work together to fill it with water.






Green Class




















Green Class have made some wonderful Mother's Day cards!








Blue Class

Working in groups, we have looked at the effectiveness of our writing.
































We have loved taking our learning outside over the last couple of weeks. The good weather allowed us to carry on with our Rhodopis work out on the playground.
