Learn a poem to recite to the class that has a Greek theme or is based on a fable/myth.	Write an advert persuading people to attend the ancient Olympic Games.	Investigate the different symbols for the gods. You could pick your favourite god and make them a mood board e.g. Poseidon's would be sea themed.	Make a Greek mask of a Greek god or character. Extra team points for 3D designs and creativity!	The Olympics committee have asked you to create a new Olympic sport. Explain the rules of this new sport. Include diagrams to help your explanation.
Find out about the Greek alphabet and present your findings in an exciting way.	Take your favourite Greek myth or an Aesop's fable and turn it into a comic strip/graphic novel (where pictures play as much of a role in telling the story as the text).	Research Greek pot designs. Design your own pot. For bonus points use an interest- ing technique or make a model/sculpture.	Design and create your own Greek costume.	Who was Pythagoras? How is he linked to maths? What is Pythagoras' theory? Present your findings – use diagrams to explain what you have learnt.
Find out how the Greeks would have used an abacus in everyday life.	Greeks loved the theatre. Write a play to perform to the class. This can be done in small groups if you wish.	Make a collage using pictures from holiday brochures etc. showing ancient buildings and interesting place to visit in Greece.	Create your own Greek building model with its own backdrop. (You could create several backdrops that you could change like a mini Greek puppet theatre.)	Create a power point about any Ancient Greek topic that interests you. Be prepared to share it with the class.
