
This half term our topic is, 'Marvellous Me'.

Blue Class



We have worked in small groups to explore where the Viking homeland countries and settlements are located in the world. We also used our fingers to draw the route that the Vikings would have sailed as they left Scandinavia for pastures new.

Our PE focus is basketball. We love it so much that we even play it during our breaktimes.




Mr M has been teaching us coding -or maybe it's the other way round
