#### The Storm Unicorn

This week, we launched our new Talk for Writing unit, all about The Storm Unicorn. The children had great fun trying to guess what our mystery creature was, based on the clues given to them. They also acted out different parts of the description.





This week, we started our Remembrance art project. We looked at the artwork of Jacqueline Hurley and researched the techniques she uses to create her pieces. We have also had a go at colour mixing, experimenting with different shades of red. Next, we will be experimenting with ways to thicken paint to create texture. We will be completing our final Remembrance art pieces in time for Friday 11th November.

We have been making good use of concrete resources this week, to help us build our knowledge of addition and subtraction.

To celebrate the Festival of Light – Diwali – the children learned the story of Rama and Sita and why it is important to Hindus. We looked at how children, like themselves, celebrate by gathering together with family, decorating their homes, cooking up a feast and lighting up the holiday. The children created their own craft Diva Lamps and made coconut ice to try and to share.

Blue Class have returned and settled back into school life incredibly well. All of the children, took it upon themselves to tidy up the playground after a recent storm. 




































### Violet Class


