This week, we welcomed parents and carers to our book and a bagel sessions in Red, Orange and Yellow Class. This was a great opportunity to share our love of reading and we were delighted that so many of you could make it.









We started our Traditional Tales Topic with a bang! A real-life news broadcast arrived in class, and it turned out a poor, old man had lost his Gingerbread Man! He jumped out of his oven, and ran away. The children had a quick hunt for it, but it couldn't

be seen. They came up with some ideas to try and catch him, including making a trap. We soon got to work, and what brilliant ideas we had.











Our excitement continued this week, as we arrived at school to find a visitor had left behind white, flour footprints. We have continued to learn the story through a story map and the children have done really well learning the words and actions to the story. We have also been busy sequencing the story, thinking about the beginning, middle and the end before we innovate the story together.

In Maths we have been learning to represent numerals 6,7 and 8 using different resources. Take a look at our work.











The children had a great time with our visiting artist, Lois Jones who showed us how to roll and print with clay. All of the children listened really well and represented the school so well. We can't wait to see our final creations in a couple of weeks time.

William Morris Art Week

This week, we have focused on the famous artist, William Morris, linking with our Victorian project. Green Class absolutely LOVE anything to do with creativity and, once again, we've been SO impressed

by the care they have taken over their work and the high level of skill they have shown! We have looked at symmetry, rotation and repeating patterns; participated in a clay workshop to make a Victorian-style decorated tile (thank you, Lois, for visiting our school!); found out about the impact Morris had on design and creativity during the Victorian era, as well as learning about 'The Arts and

Crafts Movement'; recorded facts about Morris and decorated them so beautifully in his style and created motifs, using nature to inspire our designs. Later in the week, we will be putting all of these skills together to create our final art piece - designing a block print to build a Morris-inspired design. The children have absolutely loved taking part in this art week and the quality of their work really has

Once we arrived in the field, we found our new Talk 4 Write text, 'Deforestation of the Amazon rainforest,' attached to a tree. We discussed how this made us feel and our understanding of deforestation, which really impressed Mrs Flores and Mr McGarry. After this, we returned to the class and watched a BBC News video on deforestation.







We all have been very active in our learning, and have thoroughly enjoyed creating actions to help us recall our text from memory.

We even had the chance to become David Attenborough or a Brazilian Tree Logger, whilst the rest of us used our questions that we prepared, prior to our visit to deepen our understanding of deforestation. We particularly enjoyed this, and all asked insightful questions, whilst our visitors gave some really impressive answers that blew the staff away.
