Then use your toys to act it out for a family member!	Create a cartoon character and draw them taking an adventure.	Build an 'insect hotel' outdoors and see which creatures decide to live in it.	Create a dance to your favourite song. Think about balances, shapes and travelling. See if you can teach this to somebody else in your family.
