
Curriculum Pevelopment ...



We are about to launch a brand new (invite only) Lego Club but... we were wondering of anyone would like to donate some Lego to us.


We do have some in school and will invest in more but were hoping for donations of unwanted Lego sets, Lego people or any random or interesting pieces.

production of The Secret Garden'?




We are holding auditions on the **afternoon of Sunday 18th November** here at the Minack.
