Helen spoke to Blue Class about her inspirations, favourite sports (apart from rowing), the importance of a healthy diet and how hard you have to train to achieve your dreams!

Its safe to say Blue Class were all very excited and are very much looking forward to starting their new project after the Easter holidays.





Helen also treated the whole school to an extra assembly where she explained all about her life as an Olympic Rower and gave the children the opportunity to ask her lots of interesting questions.

Please can we have all kits returned to school as soon as possible, thank you.






Wishing you all a wonderful Easter holidays.
