





Red Class Home Learning Grid—Dangerous dinosaurs

Read It	Write It	Paint/ Draw It	Make It	Count it
If you have the story. 'Harry and the bucketful of dinosaurs' read it to someone at home.	Keep practicing to write your name.	Design a new specie of dinosaur and give it a name, be as imaginative as you can.	Using a phone/ iPad/ tablet take a photograph of your obstacle course.	Begin learning to subtract 2 single-digit numbers using dinosaurs or different teddies in your home. Learn this symbol (to takeaway, subtract, minus) Subtraction 
Choose one of your favourite stories from your house and ask someone at home to read it to you. Can you tell them what the author and the illustrator do, where you can find the title and can you guess what might happen at different points in the story. (Remember to write them in your reading record)	Using your obstacle photograph, write to me telling me all about the obstacle course you made. I would love to know what you used to build it, who helped you, what you had to do. For example, did you climb, roll, squeeze, stamp. (I'm not there to see so tell me all about it)	Paint a habitat picture for your dinosaur. Think about where they live and what it might look like.	Make an obstacle course in your house or garden. Think about things that you can climb over, move around, climb through and under like a dinosaur. (Make sure an adult is there to help you)	Complete these sums, using this example. (It helps when children physically move objects to support their learning) Example I had 3 dinosaurs, but 1 dinosaur went outside so now I only have 2 dinosaurs left. Our number sentence is ... $3-1=2$.
Find a blanket and take a book outside in the sunshine.	Write labels for your new dinosaur specie. What is it called? What parts are on your dinosaur? Add your writing to your dinosaur picture in the 'paint it' column.	Look out of the window. Paint what you can see. Try using as many different colours as possible.	Make a 2D dinosaur picture, cut out the shapes first, try and name the shapes too. 	Complete some more using toys to help you. $4-2=$ $6-3=$ $2-1=$ $8-3=$ $9-6=$
Practice reading your 'tricky' words: He Me She We Be	Write 3 sentences about your dinosaur. Here is one to help you. My dinosaur has green claws.	Paint a rainbow and place it in your window for people to see when they walk past.	Make a fruit squash ice-lolly and eat it outside in the sunshine, Maybe you can make some for the members in your family.	Put a pile of toys together and count how many you have. Can you find one more and one less than the pile you have by taking one away each time, or adding one each time.
Find a non-fiction book/ article and see what facts you can find out about dinosaurs.	Practice writing your 'tricky' words He Me She We Be	Use a colouring book at home and take some time out to colour and draw.	Explore mini mash on purple mash, you all have your logins. See what you can make and explore the Programme.	Ask an adult if you can go though the food cupboards. Find some items and compare which is the following: Tallest Shortest Smallest Biggest Heaviest Lightest Draw them in your book and label them.
