Years 6 and 2 have been working so hard during their End of Key Stage 1 and 2 Assessments. Their attitude has really blown us away and we are so proud of them all!



Thursday is pond dipping and a trip to our local play park


Friday is all about water games which we all know will end in a water fight (please bring change of clothes and towel)
