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

Red class have enjoyed taking part in Science week. We explored magnets and how they work. We also completed some floating and sinking experiments with different materials.



The children replicated Newquay Zoo outdoors and provided tours for their friends equipped with a map. Did you know Giraffes only sleep for 5 minutes at a time?!







