Break time Snacks

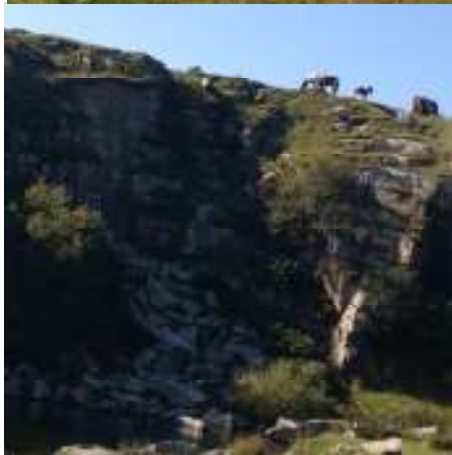
A Polite Reminder!
