Our overall attendance figure for last week was **94.4%** and based on the Ofsted grades this would be considered

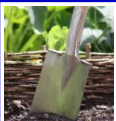

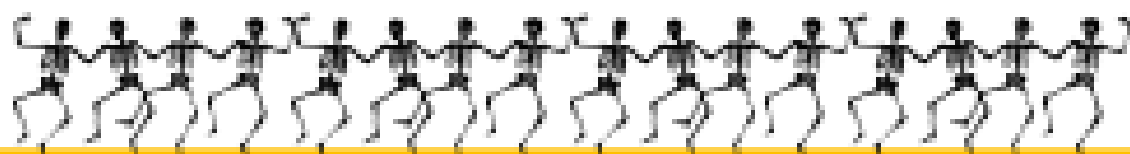
