As time moved on from the 1960s into the 1970s, fashion trends changed, but certain items remained. Fashionable styles of clothing from the 1960s continued to be popular throughout the next decade. However, some elements of the clothes evolved and became recognizable as **70**s fashion statements.



Elongated Collars





Both men and women enjoyed wearing **shirts** with **wide**, **elongated collars**. These gave the wearer a <u>smar t yet casual</u> appearance. They could be worn either *with* or *without* a suit.

Cheap shirts would have been made out of polyester or cotton. Fine-quality, expensive shirts would have been made out of silk - the most comfortable fabric to wear.

Bell Bottom Trousers and Flared Jeans



Denim was consistently popular as a clothing fabric throughout the 1970s.

A new style of trouser was invented which had wide openings at the bottom of the legs.



These 'flared' trousers were also called 'bell-bottoms' because the leg got wider from the knee down, creating a bell shape at the bottom.

Flares came in a lot of different colours.



Jeans could easily be transformed into flares by adding a triangle of fabric at the bottom.
