Instructions:

Remember:

- Sequence your events by using time conjunctions.

First, Next, Then, After that, At that moment, Just then,
A while later, Finally,

- Use fronted adverbials (verbs, adverbs, locations) at the start of your sentences.

- Include speech and speech marks (inverted commas) to show the words that people speak to each other.

“What shall we do?” I asked the driver.
